The last 10 years has generated a considerable amount of hard evidence on the kind of programs that are most cost effective for improving health and education, but we are really just getting started with the thorny questions of how to resolve conflict and improve governance. Do employment programs for youth really prevent conflict? Or community reconciliation efforts? We are only just starting to find out what really works (and what doesn't).
